

	Licensing Data Executive Director Ms. D'Antonio informed the Board that the pharmacist renewal had opened on December 1, 2014. As of December 4, 2014, 43 pharmacist licenses were renewed. The pharmacist renewal will expire on February 28, 2015. Reminder notices of the renewal will be communicated to all licensed pharmacists throughout the renewal period. Ms. D'Antonio further reported that the Department's licensing system will be experiencing an upgrade and will be down on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day. This will allow applicants by the either the end of January or the beginning of February to submit new license applications online for all Health Care Professionals. Anytime between now and after New Year's, the system will continue to allow Pharmacist to renew their licenses accordantly.	
	NABP Annual Meeting Executive Director, Ms. D'Antonio informed the Board that she and Board Member, Alan Friedman were able to attend the NABP Regional Meeting in Williamsburg, VA. Board Member, Alan Friedman informed the Board that the meeting was extremely educational and was his first opportunity to attend a NABP AACP District I and II meeting. This meeting is a joint district meeting of NABP and AACP which gives an opportunity to address not only professional issues affecting today's pharmacy practice, but also educational matters influencing tomorrow's pharmacists. The amendments as follows: 9103.2 \$\sigma\$: (h) Extemporaneous- Sterile and non sterile Compounding; (l) Federal and District laws and regulations governing (added: controlled substances) and practice of pharmacy; and 9110.2 \$\sigma\$ (k) Assisting the pharmacist in preparing and reconstituting parenteral products sterile products and other medications;

	As a result of a recent national pharmacy practice analysis survey conducted by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP), the Association has determined that revisions to the current North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination (NAPLEX) competency statements are necessary.
	The new NAPLEX competency statements are expected to go into effect on November 1, 2015.
	In addition to the competency statement updates, a standard setting study will be conducted in March 2015 to evaluate the current NAPLEX passing standards and to determine if any adjustments will be recommended. The study will help to ensure that the performance standard is valid and appropriate for contemporary practice standards.
