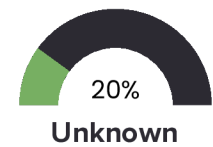
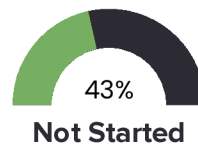
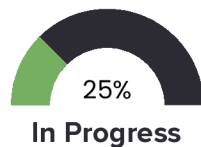
The D.C. State Board Education (SBOE) passed 24 resolutions between January 2019 through September 2024 that focused on improving the experiences of school staff and educators within D.C. public and public charter schools. These include building capacity for school mental and physical health supports, improving student safety, and addressing chronic absenteeism and truancy.

The purpose of this analysis is to provide a snapshot of resolution clauses' completion status, level of prescriptiveness, and target agencies responsible for adopting SBOE recommendations.

Further work may include (1) following up with target agencies on the status of SBOE resolution recommendations and (2) tracking the status of recommendations made by the Office of the Ombudsman for Public Education (OMB) and the Office of the Student Advocate (OSA) in their respective annual reports.

Key Insights

Target Agencies

OSSE stood out as the top target agency to adopt SBOE resolution recommendations; 26 agencies, including SBOE, DCPS, the mayor's office, etc. were mentioned in resolution clauses.

Yearly Trends

Since 2019, there has been an upward trend in resolution passage; 2022 saw a significant increase (mostly due to CRs passed).

Level of Clarity

Over two thirds of resolution clauses were clear and prescriptive; they included at least two of the following: a start/end date, target agency, measurable outcome, and unambiguous language.

Status

Most resolution clauses are either in progress or not started. Most have not been completed. One out of five have an unknown status and may require following-up with partner agencies.
