Open Meeting

I. Greetings:

- The Opioid Fatality Review Board meeting began at 3:05pm and opened with Dr. Jewell Reddick (Vice- Chair) greeting board members and invited guests.
- Dr. Luke Short (Chair) announced that he would be leaving his position at DC Government and would no longer serve as OFRB Chair.
- Initial introductions and roll-call of Board members, invited guests and staff.
