Office of Government Relations (OGR) Report Updates	 Health Occupations Revision Act (HORA) Update Health Occupations Revision Act (HORA) Update: DC Health worked on a significant revision of the HORA. This would be the first significant revision in seventeen years. The revised HORA received Mayoral approval and has been introduced in the Council as the <i>Health Occupations Revision General Amendment Act of 2023</i> (B25-0545). This legislation received a hearing on December 7th. Over 80 witnesses, many of whom were healthcare professionals, signed up to provide testimony. DC Health's Associate Director of Health Professional Licensing Boards provided testimony in support and answered questions from the Council. A mark-up was held on March 21st, 2024. This legislation was unanimously approved on the first and second readings, signed by the Mayor on May 29th, and became law on July 23, 2024. Council Recess: The District of Columbia Council will be on recess from July 15th through September 15th. During that time, the Council can conduct limited activity. 	Ms. Kera Johnson
