#### ii. Natural Language Processing (NLP):

- NLP algorithms can analyze veterinary literature, case reports, and clinical notes to extract relevant information.
- Veterinarians can benefit from Al-generated summaries and recommendations.

#### iii. Diagnostics and Imaging:

Al algorithms can analyze medical images (such as X-rays, MRIs, and ultrasounds) to assist veterinarians in diagnosing conditions like fractures, tumors, or organ abnormalities.

#### iv. Predictive Analytics:

- Al models can predict disease outbreaks, track disease trends, and assess risk factors in animal populations for example, predicting the spread of infectious diseases or identifying at-risk animals for preventive measures.

#### v. Treatment Planning:

- Al can recommend personalized treatment plans based on an individual animal's health history, genetics, and response to previous treatments.
- It can also suggest optimal drug dosages and monitor treatment effectiveness.

#### vi. Health Monitoring:

- Wearable devices and sensors equipped with AI can continuously monitor vital signs, detect anomalies, and alert veterinarians to potential health issues.
- This real-time monitoring enhances early disease detection and intervention.

#### vii. Research and Drug Discovery:

- Al assists in analyzing large datasets, identifying genetic markers, and predicting drug interactions.
- It accelerates research and drug development for both animals and humans.

	In November 2024, Colorado passed Proposition 129, creating the
	Veterinary Professional Associate (VPA) role, regulated by the Colorado
	State Board of Veterinary Medicine. Despite a 2024 AAVSB survey showing





only 38% support for a midlevel veterinary practitioner, the proposition passed, shifting the AAVSB Board's focus to public protection and VPA training standards. The Board will develop model regulations, educational resources, a national exam, and credentialing programs to ensure VPAs are qualified. Leveraging its expertise in veterinary exams, the AAVSB aims to standardize VPA licensure and support member boards. The VPA will be discussed at the March 2025 ED/Registrars Summit.

#### **AAVSB to Discontinue PAVE for Veterinary Technicians**

After a long and careful consideration, the AAVSB Board of Directors has decided to discontinue the Program for the Assessment of Veterinary Education Equivalence (PAVE) for Veterinary Technicians program. This is effective immediately.

### LEGISLATIVE/REGULATIONS PDMP

#### Pets in Housing Amendment Act of 2024:

- On May 22<sup>nd</sup>, Councilmember R. White along with Councilmembers Bonds, Pinto, T. White, and Lewis George introduced the *Pets in Housing Amendment Act of 2024* (<u>B25-0827</u>).
  - This legislation limits fees by housing providers (monthly rent and security deposits) for pets as well as banning breed restrictions.
- This legislation has been referred to the Committee on Housing, and a <u>hearing</u> was held on October 8, 2024.
- Following a markup on November 21<sup>st</sup>, the legislation was passed on first reading on December 3<sup>rd</sup> and second reading on December 17<sup>th</sup> by a unanimous vote. It was <u>Enacted</u> without the Mayor's signature on January 16, 2025.
- It has since been transmitted to Congress with a projected law date of March 27, 2025.

### Clean Hands Economic Expansion and Revitalization Amendment Act of 2025

- Councilmember McDuffie reintroduced the Clean Hands Certification Economic Expansion and Revitalization Amendment Act of 2025 (<u>B26-0054</u>) on January 13, 2025.
  - This legislation would remove the Clean Hands requirement from several occupational and professional licenses including any health professional license issued through DC Health.
- A <u>hearing</u> was held on June 20, 2024.

#### DC Health FY 24 Performance Oversight Hearing

- DC Health recently had its performance oversight hearing in the Committee on Health for Fiscal Year 2024.
- The first part of the hearing was held on February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2025. That hearing featured public witnesses and included representatives from community members, advocates, and stakeholders. That hearing can be watched at the following link.
- Representatives from DC Health then testified to the Committee on February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Testimony was provided by Director Bennett and other members of leadership and subject matter experts. Councilmembers asked questions of DC Health on a variety of topics including the agency's reorganization, school health, the launch of new programs, and the agency's response to emergency situations. #### **Board Performance Oversight Hearing**

The new Veterinary Technician and Euthanasia Technicians regulations became effective Friday, August 6, 2021. At this time, the DC Department of Health will not be issuing registrations until the process is in place.

The Department of Health is currently creating the platform by which individuals can submit an application for registration as either a Veterinary Technician or a Veterinary Euthanasia Technician. Once the platform is available, there will be a grace period for which individuals will need to come into full compliance.

11202 EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS





**11202.1** Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, an applicant for veterinary technician certification shall furnish proof satisfactory to the Board that the applicant has successfully graduated from a two (2) year associate program in the practice of veterinary technology or animal health at an institution accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) Committee on Veterinary Technician Education and Activities (CVTEA) at the time the applicant graduated.

#### 11203 NATIONAL EXAMINATION

**11203.1** To qualify for certification, an applicant shall furnish proof of having obtained, no more than seven (7) years prior to the submission of a certification application under this chapter, a passing score on the Veterinary Technician National Examination (VTNE) or its successor examination, administered by the American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB) or its successor.

**11203.2** The passing score for the VTNE shall be as established by AAVSB.

**11203.3** An applicant shall arrange for the score to be transmitted to the Board directly from AAVSB.

### 11204 KNOWLEDGE OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA VETERINARY JURISPRUDENCE

11204.1 To qualify for certification under this section, an applicant shall demonstrate to the Board's satisfaction that he or she possesses competent knowledge and understanding of the laws and rules pertaining to veterinary practice in the District. The Board may adopt or implement a District of Columbia Veterinary Jurisprudence Examination or other methods such as mandatory educational sessions.

11205 ALTERNATIVE QUALIFICATION THROUGH EDUCATION AND TRAINING





**11205.1** Notwithstanding the requirement of § 11202, an applicant who does not meet the requirement of § 11202.1 may qualify for a veterinary technician certification if he or she:

- (a) Has completed, with a minimum passing grade of C or equivalent, at least two-hundred and thirty (230) clock hours of post-secondary instruction relevant to the practice of veterinary technician, which includes:
- (1) Biology I;
- (2) Biology II;
- (3) Microbiology;
- (4) Chemistry;
- (5) Anatomy and physiology I; and
- (6) Anatomy and physiology II; and
- (b) Has accrued at least four thousand (4,000) hours of Directed Clinical Practice under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian
